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1. APPLICATION PROCESS




WELCOME!

TO PRESENT

If the Project Review Committee selects your project for additional review, we will contact you to explain next steps. If you don't hear from us, check our website to see which project was ultimately chosen.

PRESENT

Projects that are selected by the Review Committee for additional review will be required to prepare and present either a video or a PowerPoint (PPT) presentation. We cannot accept video or PPT submissions during the initial application round.

SELECTED

Based on current funding, one project will be chosen in 2020. All those who were asked to present to the Review Committee will be contacted to let them know whether their project was selected or not.

2. WHAT IS THE GREEN CITIES FOUNDATION?



OUR MISSION

Green Cities Foundation is a community connecting plants and people for a greener, healthier urban climate

According to the 2016 Statistics Canada Census, 83% of Canadians currently live in cities.

The Green Cities Foundation (GCF) has identified the need of people living in Canadian urban communities to improve the quality of their health by increasing the number and quality of green spaces they can enjoy, by cleaning up the air they breathe, by reducing big city noise, and by cooling down increasingly hot outdoor temperatures.

We believe these benefits can be achieved by increasing the quantity and quality of living plants, trees, shrubs, turf grass, and perennials in the community.

OUR VISION and COMMITMENT

We commit to protect the environment, to restore or improve public urban green spaces and brownfields, to provide healthier enjoyable public amenities, to reduce & remediate polluted air and increase rainwater absorption, and to reduce noise, by establishing and maintaining regenerative, living plants, trees, shrubs, perennials, turf grass and water features in Canadian urban communities.

3. WHAT IS GREEN REVITALIZATION?



The Green Cities Foundation invites community volunteers to identify public spaces in urban locations across Canada that would benefit from *green revitalization* – landscape restoration or improvement - to improve urban air and water quality, and create healthy, public amenities.



PLANTS clean the **AIR** we breathe by removing nitrogen dioxide, CO₂ and microscopic particulate matter as part of their photosynthesis. In effect, they absorb pollutants and release oxygen. ¹ When we talk about "plants" in this guide, we are also talking about trees, shrubs, and grasses.



Healthy **SOIL** is important for the health, growth and maintenance of plants. Plants in urban areas rely on soil to absorb, retain and release water when they need it. If plants have the right soil, watering can be reduced, which saves money and the strain on municipal water treatment systems.



Cities tend to have a lot of hard surfaces, such as concrete and asphalt, which don't absorb **WATER**. As a result, heavy rainfall can cause dangerous and damaging flooding in these areas. Increasing the amount of green space in these urban areas can help to mitigate this problem by absorbing rainwater.



Soil and plants capture and absorb rainwater, which then evaporates into the air through the soil and foliage. This process **COOLS** the air by using heat from the air for the process of evaporation. ² In addition, the shade provided by trees also provides cooling.



While it would be impossible to achieve **SILENCE** outdoors, leaves, rough bark, and stems can absorb, deflect, refract and ultimately reduce the level of **SOUND** that might otherwise bounce off hard city surfaces, such as walls, sidewalks and roadways.

4. ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?



WHO MAY APPLY?

Garden clubs, member associations, neighbourhood groups, service clubs and school/youth groups are encouraged to apply.

WHAT ARE ELIGIBLE GREEN REVITALIZATION PROJECTS?

Maybe there's a public park in your neighbourhood that has been neglected, is run down, or needs some love and attention? Or maybe your local soccer field is a mucky mess every time it rains, and it's in need of a renovation?

Any publicly owned land that could contribute more productively to your community's overall health and wellbeing may be eligible for restoration or revitalization. We want to help communities create or improve green spaces that people will be able to enjoy, and that will improve air, soil, and water quality, and quality of life.

We want to hear your story – how you see your project improving your community.

WHERE ARE ELIGIBLE PROJECT LOCATIONS?

Projects must be located on publicly owned, accessible open spaces in urban Canadian communities, including the following:

5. HOW DOES IT WORK?



WHO PAYS FOR EVERYTHING?

An ideal Green My City Project would be one in which the applicant is fully engaged and committed to partnering with the Green Cities Foundation by fundraising in their own community, recruiting community volunteers, and even donating to the project themselves.

The Green Cities Foundation will match and enhance community efforts by coordinating donations, corporate partnerships, and volunteer skilled landscapers and landscape designers to ensure each project is successfully built, while working with and educating community volunteers every step of the way. The total available budget for building the project may be as much as \$80,000 in addition to donated services and materials.

PROJECT TIMELINE

SEPTEMBER – DECEMBER

- Apply online at GCFoundation.ca/apply
- A copy of your submitted application will be emailed to you once submitted.

JANUARY - FEBRUARY

- Applications will be reviewed by the Green Cities Foundation's Project Review Committee.
- Eligible project candidates will receive an invitation to present their project to the Project Review Committee in March.

MARCH

- Eligible project candidates will be asked to submit a brief video or PowerPoint presentation of their project.
- Presentations will be reviewed by the Project Review Committee.
- Successful project applicants will be notified no later than April 1st that their project has been selected.

APRIL - OCTOBER

 Green Space Design and Build will take place during the current calendar year, or the following calendar year, depending on the scope and specifics of each project that is selected.

6. ROUND 2 VIDEO PRESENTATIONS – MARCH 2020



VIDEO PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

When you apply to the Program in 2019, you are NOT required or requested to create or submit a video/slide presentation as part of your original application.

If your project is selected for the second round of reviews by the Review Selection Committee, you will be THEN be required to submit a video or Powerpoint slide presentation of your project in the month of March. Why a video? Because the Green Cities Foundation is a national charitable organization, and project reviewers are located across Canada.

BUT WHAT ABOUT SNOW?

Imagine you receive a call from the Green Cities Foundation in February 2020 to say that you've been selected to present your project to the Project Review Committee in March. Woohoo! Now you have to put together a video or slide presentation.

In case your project area may be covered in snow in the month of March, you may wish to take videos or photos to have on hand *before* the snow flies!

The following information is included in this guide to help you understand the requirements of creating your video/slide presentation, so you can be prepared.

LIGHTS! CAMERA! ACTION!

Use your creativity and any tools at hand to take us on a tour of the potential project site. Tell us about the location, its history, what you hope to achieve, who will benefit, and the reasons why you think your project would be perfect for the Green My City Program.

7. VIDEO CONTENT and FORMAT



CONTENT

Please do not include any of the following in your presentation:

- X Children X Animals X Private Property X Profanity
- X Hateful/Racist/Harassment oriented content
- **X** Mention of specific people or business names
- X Images of people who are not named as project applicants
- X Disparaging remarks about people, businesses, or communities
- X Content promoting or illustrating illegal, sexual or illicit activities
- X Copyrighted images, music, video or graphics for which you cannot provide proof of licensing

DURATION & FORMAT

You may submit a video you make on your smart phone, or a PowerPoint slide show with photos and descriptive text. We may choose to use your "before" video and/or photos on our website, social media and marketing materials. You'll be asked to sign a waiver and release form for us to do so.

Duration: Minimum 3 minutes - Maximum 10 minutes

Video Format: mp4 or QuickTime

Slide presentations that are made in Microsoft PowerPoint or Apple Keynote - please do not send raw files. Send a **PDF version** of the presentation.

Details on where and when to send project presentations will be provided only to those candidates who have been selected to present.
